ANNUAL QUALITY ASSURANCE REPORT (2005–2006)

PART A

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the academic year (2005-2006) towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year.

• B.Ed in Commerce

The institute is proposing to commence a one-year B.Ed course in Commerce for which the proposal has already been sent to NCTE and its approval is awaited.

Initiative to start a General B.Ed. course under the affiliation of Jadavpur University was undertaken. As the Jadavpur University is a unitary university and itself has applied for a general B.Ed. at their campus to NCTE, they did not approve of the affiliation for the same.

Expansion of the college premises

The institute intends to add a third floor to the existing premises in the current session. The new floor proposes to house a state-of-the-art Conference Hall, Faculty Room for Department of Commerce along with classrooms.

Permission for the vertical expansion of the building has been granted by the plan sanctioning authority and the extension in the form of 3rd storey has begun. There will be provision for classrooms and 150-seat capacity Conference Hall.

Computerization of official work

In order to introduce modern techniques of bookkeeping and accounting, it is proposed to install Tally 7.2 and thus computerize the entire accounting system. Tally 7.2 Software has been installed in the office.

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Computer programme for office staff

Training session on Tally 7.2 and MIS would be provided to the office staff so as to make them proficient in computerized accounting and administrative tasks Office staff is using the Tally 7.2 to maintain accounts.

• Computerization of Library

Apart from an existing computerized catalogue and an online search service for books and authors, all transactions, reports etc. are to be computerized.

Brainware software has been installed in the library.

MIS

A Management information system (MIS) is shortly to be implemented with the objective of monitoring and evaluating the overall development of the teachers and students. Regular updates of attendance of students, lessons plans, etc. will be incorporated in the system.

MIS has been installed in all the three departments. In the Home Science Department its usage is limited, as the software requires some modification.

More collaborative research projects

The institute proposes to undertake research project in collaboration with the industrial sector.

- a. Street food project under Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India funded by World Bank is being carried out in three Phases and the First Phase was completed in the month of June.2006.
- b. A Minor Research Project funded by UGC in collaboration with Dean of Arts, Jadavpur University on "Trade Liberalization and its Impact on Forest - A Case Study of India" has been undertaken by the Department of Commerce.

Computer training for teaching staff

The Institute proposes to hold training sessions for the faculty members to make them conversant with computer, its working including LAN and Internet, and to provide specialized training in DTP Software.

Formal Computer training for staff could not be arranged. But teachers have learnt to handle LAN and Internet.

Strengthening of career guidance and placement cell

Establishing contacts with various placement agencies for the purpose of providing job opportunities for the students, as well as inviting various national and international business schools to conduct orientation programmes.

Efforts were made to arrange career counseling sessions, orientation programmes for the CAT aspirants, campus interview by Dell Computers, Wipro Infotech and others. Students got job offers while undergoing internship training. In the Department of Management most of the students were offered stipends for internships, the maximum being Rs.20, 000/- per month at ING Vyasa Bank. Some of the Ex-students have been recruited as Junior Officers, Marketing Executives in ICICI and HDFC Banks. Resume of ex-students are kept with the Placement Cell for future reference.

Alumni

The alumni association will continue its tradition of organizing annual reunion of the former students of the institute even this year. The Association is proposing to arrange for an excursion for the registered members as well.

Alumni association had its 2nd reunion and instead of an excursion, it organized a musical evening for both its members and the present students of the institute besides other activities.

• Extra Curricular Activity

Conduct regular competitions in sports, cultural activities, etc. apart from coordinating participation in inter-college fests.

Extra curricular activity group organized annual cultural programme, sports, quiz, and debate for its own students. The students also participated in number of inter collegiate fests and did make the college proud by winning prizes.

• Health

Seminars and presentations on various health issues like oral and dental hygiene, diet suggestions for students, special eye camps are intended to be arranged. A course of lecture on stress management is also proposed. Follow up practical workshops on the different applications of alternative medicine such as Acupressure, Reiki, Pranic Healing, Colour Therapy, etc. is also being proposed.

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Talk on AIDS, First Aid Demonstration, a workshop on Pranayam and an interactive session on Cerebral Palsy and stress management were conducted for the students.

Linkages

The institute proposes to establish links with industries in order to promote academy industry tie-up especially with respect to research projects. Efforts have already been made to collaborate with Confederation of Indian Industries (CII). The institute also intends to approach various international universities for faculty/student exchange programmes and also for collaborating on research projects.

- a. Newcastle Business School, Northumbria University Academic Link Programmes: Two students Ms. Avinanda Saha and Ms. Avirupa Saha, after completing their Third Year course at JDBI, left for Newcastle Business School for the final year programme in the undergraduate course of NBS. 22 more students have applied for Postgraduate Management Programmes at NBS for the September 2006 session. All of them have been offered scholarships and across the board 10% reduction in tuition rates [comparable to agency fees].
- b. Students of all the three departments are directed to various establishments/ organizations/ corporate offices for vocational training for a duration of one -two months.
- c. Guest faculties from different fields are invited to deliver lectures on subjects pertaining to their field of specialization, to offer the students a wider perspective.
- d. B.Sc. Final Year students specializing in the field of Textile and Clothing undergo a practical training programme in Textile Testing each year at the Institute of Jute Technology. The Institute arranges for these classes on the payment of a minimum amount of charges.

Blood donation and awareness camps

The NSS unit of the institute together with the Health activity cell proposes to arrange various awareness programmes on Cancer, AIDS, Thalassemia and other life threatening diseases. A blood donation camp may also be arranged.

a. NSS participated in "University Talk AIDS" an awareness programme, attended seminars on organ transplant, disaster management, carried out donation of books and clothes, conducted dietary survey and have also adopted a child at CINI.

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- b. The Department of Home Science of the Institute conducted an awareness campaign on Solid Waste Management using Vermicompost technique. A poster competition with this subject as the focal theme was organized on January 31, 2006 for the students of the Institute.
- Certificate Course

The department of Commerce proposes to start a new certificate course for six months in "Application of Computers in Accountancy."

- a. Department of Commerce has started a new certificate course in "Application of Computers in Accountancy."
- b. Department of Home Science started an 8-month certificate course in Textile Designing.

Vocational courses

Department of commerce proposes to start two new vocational courses free of cost on "Good Communication and Personality Development" and "Computer Programming" Department of Commerce has started a new vocational course, free of cost, on 'Good Communication and Personality Development'.

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PART B

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1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

Efforts were made to help the students develop themselves in a holistic manner through team building, excursion, academic excellence and concern for the nation.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)

- a. PG Diploma in Dietetics and Applied Nutrition in the Department of Home Science have been initiated. The same has been approved by the affiliating University.
- b. A new Post Graduate Diploma Course in collaboration with ICFAI (Indian Chartered Financial Analyst) has been proposed by the Department of Commerce. This course shall be of one year duration comprising of two semesters and a three-month internship programme. The proposed course shall either cover Post Graduate Diploma in Banking and Insurance or Post Graduate Diploma in Capital Market and Investment Analysis.

3. Revision of the curriculum and syllabus

- a. The Department of Commerce has started the process of revising their curriculum and syllabus. For this, a syllabus review committee has been formed comprising of eminent personalities from the field of academics and industry. They are:

- b. The Department of Home Science has revised the curriculum and syllabus of its existing PG Section (M.Sc. in Resource management, Human Development and the Composite Home Science). The same has got an approval from the affiliating University (Jadavpur University).

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c. The curriculum and syllabus for two new M.Sc. programmes i.e. Textiles and Clothing and Food and Nutrition have been framed. The sectional-in-charges of the above mentioned programmes visited Home Science colleges in Mumbai and Vadodara to get their suggestions on the newly framed curricula and the syllabus.

4. Innovations in curricular design and transaction

- To meet the needs and requirements of the students and in order to enhance the quality and standard of education, updating and restructuring of the curriculum is a continuous process in the institute. To enable the students to continue their education after their graduation, the PG courses in Home Science were updated and restructured giving importance to emerging areas of technology with special thrust on information technology and entrepreneurship thereby making it relevant to the present day needs and career options.
- The M.Sc. programme earlier followed the annual pattern of examination, but has now been converted to the semester pattern.
- Keeping in mind the importance of diet in relation to good health PG-Diploma in Dietetics and Applied Nutrition has been approved by the affiliating university. The curriculum has been designed in a way whereby the students present case studies, seminars and presentations. Besides this, an internship of two months duration enables them to get first hand knowledge on their field of study.
- All the three departments of the institute held regular Academic Council and General Staff Meetings during this period, discussing matters pertaining to general rules, examination, evaluation and pedagogy to be used for classroom teaching.
- Teachers at the Department of Management have been advised to use PCs provided to them for preparing LCD presentations. This presentation could subsequently be e-mailed to all students. Other departments also have started giving more importance to presentations through LCD projector, OHPs' etc. rather than the conventional board and chalk method.
- Replacement of internal mid-semester examination by paper presentation for the second year students of the Commerce Department has been initiated.

To widen the circumference of knowledge and skills of the commerce students and to $\sqrt{1}$ make them more familiar with information technology, the students are motivated to enroll themselves in a *Certificate Course on Application of Software in Accounting*, which has been started since January 2006. The duration of the course was six months. This course aims to provide in-house training in all related accounting software to students

6. Examination reforms implemented

- Class tests are held on a regular basis in all the departments.
- The examination rules for the PG Degree courses in Resource Management, Human Development, and Composite Home Science has been changed from the annual pattern to the semester system this session. The above rules have been framed and passed by the university.
- The university is contemplating on initiating one class test instead of two class tests in each semester at the UG level in Department of Home Science.
- Replacement of internal mid-semester examination by paper presentation for the second year students of Department of Commerce has been implemented.

10. Research projects a) newly implemented b) Completed <u>NEWLY IMPLEMENTED</u>

Street Food Project

The Government of India is implementing a Capacity Building Project on food supply and quality control of food with assistance from the World Bank. The project is aimed at realizing the long-term goals of the Government of India to ensure the safety and quality of food for the Indian public.

The project is being carried out in 16 cities in India including Kolkata. The total amount sanctioned for the project is approx.Rs.8,00,000/-. Mrs. Lilu Mancha and Mrs. Komal Sharma, Sr. Lecturers, Selection Grade conducting the project in Kolkata. The aim of the project is to get a clear perception of the prevalent practices and attitudes regarding food. The project consists of three phases. During the first phase (2005-2006), a survey was carried out on Street Food Providers, Food Handlers and Consumers in the city of Kolkata. The survey provided a database on the knowledge, attitude and practices of street food Vendors regarding food quality and safety. The first phase has been completed. The second phase of the project (2006-2007), is to impart education and training modules for food service providers.

National Environmental Awareness Programme

A grant of Rs 5000 was received by the college from the Ministry of Forests and Environment through the Regional Resource Centre for the National Environment Awareness Campaign. Dr Gita Zutshi and Dr Vipasha Chakraborty, Sr Lecturers, Department of Home Science, conducted the campaign in the college. A vermicompost pit was set up in the college premises using waste generated within the college and its neighbourhood. A poster competition cum exhibition was held in the college on January 31, 2006 with the theme being 'Solid Waste Disposal' and the best posters were

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awarded. A lecture on the *Benefits of Vermicomposting* was also delivered by Dr A Misra of the Zoological Survey of India on February 18, 2006.

Trade Liberalization and its Impact on Forest - A case Study of India".

Mrs Gargi Mitra, Head, Department of Commerce has received a financial assistance of Rs 60,000 from the University Grant Commission to initiate a Minor Research Project on 'Trade Liberalization and its Impact on Forest - A Case Study of India' in collaboration with Dr Biswanath Chatterjee, Dean of Arts, Jadavpur University, Kolkata. ADMINISTRATION AND ADMISSION OF STUDENTS

MIS & Student Administration Software

The MIS and Student Administration is a software required for computerization of the students' administration procedures. It incorporates the process of admission of a student to the college; monitor her activities and development throughout the tenure of her studentship and will enable us to take proper steps to apprise them of their progress at proper intervals. The MIS software is intended to provide valuable information to the management. It will incorporate two perspectives, students and faculty. It will monitor the overall performance of all students as a whole and as individuals and evaluate faculty members from both academic and administrative approach

Objective

The scope of the software:

from student's point of view:

- The student admission process by inputting the data supplied by the student to the college.

- Maintain Students' continuous internal assessment marks entry.

- List of drop-out students
- List of current batch (semester-wise / year-wise)

- List of faculty (year-wise / subject taken / batch-wise)
- Any other relevant query regarding students.
- The MIS part of the software will incorporate the following:
- Faculty details: only academic and administrative responsibilities.
- Lecture plans: faculty wise/subject wise per semester (to be fed in at the beginning of the month).
- Participation of students in extra curricular activities of the college.
- Evaluation of lecture plan by the administrator at the end of each month.
- Status of activity group and teacher coordinator: activities performed during each semester.
- Development of faculty members through paper publication, seminar presentation, attending refresher / orientation programme.

The reports generated by the system include:

- Appraisal of student: academic and non-academic (qualitative report on each student) each semester.
- Teacher's appraisal: academic & administrative. It will incorporate the completion of lecture plans, absenteeism, student's feedback and self-development activities.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counseling units

The services of a counselor were hired for this session. The counselor was available thrice a week to advice on the following problems:

- Stress resulting in headaches, backaches, lack of concentration during examinations.
- Family and personal problems
- Anorexia cases

• Behavioral problems like cheating, absenteeism, forging teachers' signatures Besides handling and advising students on these problems, the counselor would also have classroom interactions for sensitization and awareness about benefits of counseling procedures.

37. Placement services provided to students

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell of the institute has been working in these areas in the last academic year

- Workshops

Workshops on 'Career Opportunities after acquiring Bachelor's and/or Master's / degrees in Home Science' were conducted by Ms. Shaila Jassal (ex- faculty of the Department of Home Science and currently associated with 'Innov', an agency The Vocational Training Programme in the Department of Home Science has enabled many students to be recruited in the organization where they have undergone training such as export houses, garment manufacturing units, architectural firms, hospitals, hotels, schools and other organizations.

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39. Healthy practices of the institution

EXCURSION:

- a. Excursions cum team building exercises were conducted in the following places by the Department of Management: 79 students (First and Fifth semester) went on a trip to **Darjeeling** (November 12 – 16, 2005), 90 students (First, Third and Fifth semester) went on a trip to **Singapore** (April 10 – 14, 2006). Team building games were organized every evening during the trip and prizes were awarded to the best team.
- b. Educational excursions were also organized for final year students of B.Sc. to Mumbai and Goa (Resource Management, Food & Nutrition and Composite sections), Hyderabad and Vishakhapatnam (Human Development section) and Gujarat (Textile & Clothing section). This exercise helped them to broaden their horizon at the same time instilled a sense of team spirit in them.
- c. Pleasure trip to Lucknow, Nainital, Haridwar and Musssorie was also organized for the students of the Home science Department.
- d. For the students of Department of Commerce pleasure trip to Goa and Mumbai was organized from December 23-31, 2005.
- Transparency is maintained in the internal examination by showing the evaluated answer scripts to them and discussing the different lacunas with the examinees thereby facilitating teacher student interaction.
- Class test results are communicated to the parents to apprise them of the progress of their wards.
- Groups comprising of both strong and weak students are given assignments for better peer interaction and learning.

- Student's feedback on the curriculum and teacher's performance is collected, evaluated and maintained.
- Student's grievances box is installed and the their complaints/ suggestions are considered regularly by the Principal.

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- The Institute awards financial assistance in the form of Scholarships to financially weaker students in the form of waving off the entire tuition fee for one complete Academic Session. Five such scholarships can be awarded per year.
- The Management invites eminent personalities and organizes seminars /panel discussions for the faculty members of their institute on Teachers' Day. Faculty members are encouraged for better performance through Awards for Best Overall Performance and an award for Publication/ Presentation of Research Papers in reputed Journals, which is followed by a lunch.
- Salaries of all the employees are credited into their bank accounts before the end of every month.
- Faculty members are motivated to participate in seminars, conferences and workshops and the Institute at times pays for the registration fees and grants duty leave to the concerned faculty for the said period.
- Class IV employees are encouraged to participate in college sports and other cultural functions viz. Independence day, Sarswati puja etc.
- Morning Assembly is conducted everyday for all students. It begins with a prayer, followed by the narration of a thought for the day. Any information to be disseminated to the students is announced during this time.

40. Linkages developed with national/ International, Academic/ research Bodies

NewCastle Business School (NBS), Northumbria University Academic Link Programmes: Two students Ms. Avinanda Saha and Ms. Avirupa Saha, after completing their third year, Department of Management, were allowed to enroll for the final year programme in the undergraduate course at NBS. 22 more students have also applied for Postgraduate Management Programme at NBS for the September 2006 session. All of them have been offered scholarships and across the board 10% reduction in tuition rates [comparable to agoncy fees]. UGC sponsored Minor Research Project on "Trade Liberalization in the Forest Product Sector" is being carried out by the Institute. This is being carried out in collaboration with the Department of Economics, Jadavpur University and Department of Commerce, Smt J D Birla Institute.

41. Any other relevant information

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- Fresher's Party was organized, separately, by the students of Departments of Home Science and Commerce.
- Independence Day and Saraswati Puja were celebrated at the Institute.
- A Talent Show was organized in the month of September in which the First Year students were given an opportunity to stage their talent.
- Sweety Sureka and Tuhina Agarwal from the Department of Commerce participated in the inter-college L. N. Birla National Debate.
- An Annual Show was organized on February 23, 2006 at Vidya Mandir. The theme of the annual show for the Home Science Department was "Colures of India" and the show encased dances accompanied by songs of various Indian states like Punjab, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Assam, Maharashtra and Kerela and the students walking down the ramp showcasing the bridal costumes of various states of India. The theme for the Department of Commerce was "Evolution of Dance".
- College has an elected Student's Council in both the Departments of Commerce and Home Science. Members are elected for the post of Head Girl (one from each Department), Assistant Head Girl (one from each Department), Class Representatives from all the sections of under-graduate and pos-graduate courses.

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Detail of the plans of the institution for the next year

- Department of Management intends to formalize 140 seats as the official number of intake for their BBA programme. They plan to submit their report to JU Department of Engineering.
- A proposal for PG programme has been sent to the JU Vice Chancellor for 'Masters in Management Practice' to provide for upward mobility of B.Com and BBA students.
- Home Science to Start Individual Departments: In order to keep up with the changing times and the need of the hour, Department of Home Science is planning to initiate Bachelor degree programme in the different disciplines of Home Science viz. Food Science and Technology, Textile and Clothing Science, Human Development, Resource Management and General Home Science instead of the current curriculum. Currently, these said areas of specialization are offered to the students in the Final Year of the Graduate Programmes.
- Specialization in Commerce Undergraduate Courses: Necessary revision of the curricula and syllabi is done periodically to keep the same at par with the international standards of education and to conform to the emerging attitudes and environmental factors. Keeping this in mind, the Department of Commerce has planned to introduce three specializations in the Final Year of their Undergraduate B. Com. Programme:
 - a. Bachelor of Accountancy and Finance
 - b. Bachelor in Marketing
 - c. Bachelor in Banking and Insurance

A Review Committee comprising of eminent members from relevant fields has been formed to discuss the new syllabus and curriculum.

 Autonomy: Smt J D Birla Institute, established in 1962, functions as full-fledged institution with three Departments (Home Science, Commerce and Management) providing graduate, post graduate and doctoral degree and is affiliated to the highly accredited Jadavpur University of Kolkata. But as the college is now geared up to expand further, with the introduction of new degree courses, it has now become necessary to get Autonomy from the University in order to expedite this expansion procedure. Past records of the three Departments of the institute shows that the college has been improving with every passing year and the results of the students including the position of the alumni in the society vindicates the stand. Keeping this in mind, the Institute has applied for an 'Autonomy Status' from the University and dialogues are on with the concerned authorities regarding the same.

To continue with bridge and remedial courses.

- To continue with the existing short-term courses and additionally starting new courses for internal revenue generation. The new courses planned are as follows:
 - a. Jewelry Designing
 - b. Specialized Batik
 - c. Ceramic Designing
 - d. Tanjore Painting
 - e. Sari Draping

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- f. Various Other Crash Courses
- g. Computer Training
- Expansion of College Premises: Permission to initiate the vertical expansion of the college building has been granted. The construction of the third floor is underway. A 150-senter Conference Hall is to be constructed on this floor (west wing). The rest of the constructed area is to be utilized as classrooms.
- Computerization of Office / Accounting: Office staff requires training in TALLY, which will be initiated in the next session. MIS also needs to be installed in the administrative office.
- Improvement in Library: Up gradation and improvement in the library would be initiated in many ways:
 - a. Bar-coding of books
 - b. Increase in library timings
 - c. Booking of books
 - d. Increase in the number of Research journals and magazines
 - e. Orientation Programme (particularly for First Year students) regarding maintenance of library and proper usage of books and other learning material

- f. Initiation of a section on Computer Aided teaching aids
- **Career Guidance:** The Institute has the following procedures outlined for the ensuing session:
 - a. Bio-data of students registered with Placement Cell would be sent to the different placement agencies
 - b. Mock interviews and group discussions would be organized for present as well as the ex- students.
 - c. Maintaining contacts with different organizations for the purpose of Industrial Training/future placement.
 - d. Efforts to increase contacts with prospective employers.
 - Alumni: A database of the ex students of the institute would be maintained so that when required, the Institute may call upon their services. An annual reunion, an excursion/picnic for registered members is being planned for the next session. Food festivals, seminars on health and nutrition, a musical entertainment in the form of DJ nite / dandia etc. would be organized for the present students and the alumni members.
 - Linkages with other Institutes: Talks are going on regarding linkages with CII, ICFAI, ARENA multimedia and Institute of Jute Technology.
 - College Magazine: An annual college magazine will continue to be brought out.

Staff Development:

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- a. More programmes to be organized with an objective to facilitate team building.
- b. A workshop on stress management will be organized for faculty members from all the departments.
- c. Faculty members will be motivated and encouraged to pursue research programmes.
- d. A short course on 'Accounts and Taxation' will be organized for the benefit of teachers and staff to acquaint them with Taxation Rules and Savings Options.
- e. A course is being planned for the Class IV staff, to acquaint them with the procedures to apply for loans and investments.

- f. It is also envisaged to initiate a computer course for teachers to familiarize them , with the softwares required in preparing different aids for classroom teaching.
- g. A tie-up with selected medical centres is being considered to enable teaching and non-teaching staff to undergo medical checkups at discounted rates.

Research Activity:

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- Two seminars approved by the UGC will be held during the next session on February 23 and 24, 2007 respectively. These are:
 - UGC sponsored national seminar on 'Necessity & Scope of Collaborative Research on Higher Education' organized by all the three Departments.
 - UGC national seminar on 'Scope for Industry- Institute linkage in the field of Commerce' to be organized by Department of Commerce.
- 2. The following activities in the area of research are under consideration:
 - a. Release of Research Journal catering to the research in the field of Home Science.
 - b. A minor research proposal on 'Standardization of the Scale Constructed in Gerontology' by Dr. Soma Dasgupta, Lecturer, Department of Home Science has been submitted to UGC and is under consideration.
 - c. The second phase of the World Bank sponsored (through Ministry of Health) project on 'Street Food' will continue with the 'Intervention Program'. The same has begun since November 2006 and is likely to be completed in July 2007.
 - d. A research proposal on *The Study of Magnetic Properties of Mono Ferrite Particles* is under consideration for submission to Inter University Consortium for Department of Atomic Energy Facilities (IUC-DAEF), Kolkata. The proposal has been submitted by Faculty, Department of Physics, University of Rajasthan with Dr. V. Chakraborty, Sr Lecturer, Department of Home Science as collaborator.
 - e. A minor project on "Effect of Microbes on Industrial Effluents" by Dr Banani De, Lecturer, Department of Home Science has been submitted to UGC and is under consideration.

- The Extra Curricular Activity: This group, in close association with the Student's Council has been and in the future going to participate in inter-college fests and organize various other cultural programs.
- Community Services
 - a. To continue with the literacy campaign 'Each One Teach One'
 - b. Participate in various NSS activities including seminars & workshops within and outside the college.
 - c. Intend to contact various NGOs and other voluntary organizations to help those in need. Foe this, a separate Community Service/ Group is being formed. The same would include willing members from both the student fraternity and teaching staff members. The group would carry out various extension services for the needy, poor and destitute.
 - d. To organize seminars and workshops on matters related to health and hygiene.
 - i. Panel Discussions on Diabetes
 - ii. Panel Discussion on HIV-AIDS
 - iii. Sex Education
 - iv. Lecture/Debate on Substance Abuse

Collaborative Research

- a. The second phase of World Bank sponsored project on 'Street Food' (under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare) is continuing with the 'Intervention Program' which has begun since November 2006 and is likely to be completed by July 2007.
- b. Planning is underway to start a collaborative research work on *Natural Dyes* with the Institute of Jute Technology, Kolkata.

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
