ANNUAL QUALITY ASSURANCE REPORT (2007–2008)

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PART A

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year has been enumerated below:

Autonomy: The Institute is planning to apply for an autonomous status from the affiliating university and for this efforts are being made to gather information related to the said issue. A "peer review" meeting is being planned during the next session; thereafter a proposal would be sent to the Jadavpur University. A workshop will be shortly conducted to orient faculty members in this matter.

A meeting to discuss issues related to autonomy of the Institute was held on 31st August 2007 at the satellite campus and was presided over by Dr. Suman Mukerjee, Director of the Institute. All faculty members from the Departments of Home Science, Commerce and Management attended the meeting. He apprised members about the benefits of having an autonomous status and stressed that the purpose of academics was not only to teach, but also to gear up students to better employment opportunities.

 The Institute is planning to increase the number of seats in the Department of Commerce, as there is more demand for this particular programme.

The Jadavpur University has officially sanctioned an increase in the number of seats in the Department of Commerce from 150 to 225 (increase by 75 seats).

• Keeping the demand for specialized professional courses in mind, faculty members from the Department of Home Science have initiated the preparation of the proposed curriculum and syllabi for the following specialized degree programmes; B.Sc in Food Science & Nutrition, B.Sc in Textile Science & Clothing Technology, B.Sc in Interior Designing, B.Sc in Human Development, B.Sc. in Consumer Science. Following this an attempt shall be made to get the programme reviewed and finally approved both by the UGC as well as the affiliating University. It is planned to offer at least one or two of the above-mentioned programmes to the students in the forthcoming session.

The curriculum & syllabi for the different areas of specializations (Food Science & Nutrition Management, Textiles Science, Clothing & Fashion Studies, Interior Designing, Human Development and Home Science) in Home Science has been developed for the purpose of starting individual departments in these specialized areas. The report has already been submitted to the University for necessary action.

Both the Departments of Home Science and Commerce is planning to carry out the
process of admissions online during the forthcoming session; this would enable
students to download the admission forms, etc directly from the website of the
college. This system is currently operative with the Department of Management.

The college website has been upgraded to enable students to download the admission forms and alumni membership form.

 Remedial classes would continue for students who have scored below par in basic science subjects.

Though provision for remedial classes in physics, chemistry and mathematics was made for the session 2007-08 there was no student enrolled for the same. Hence remedial courses have been made mandatory for students scoring either low marks at the High School examinations or for those who had offered non-science subjects at the Higher Secondary level. Such students of B.Sc. (Hons) programme in Home Science for session 2008-09 would have to take up remedial courses in Basic Chemistry, Basic Physics and Physiology; while students of the Department of Commerce would have to undertake remedial course in Mathematics.

 Computerization: The MIS that would assist in efficient administration would be operative from the next session. To make this effective each faculty members would be provided with individual computers.

Each faculty member has been provided with an individual computer; however, MIS is yet to be installed in both the Departments of Home Science and Commerce.

 A seminar on 'Environment related issues' and another on 'Women related issues' is being planned during the academic session 2007-08. A lecture on substance abuse would be held for the students of the Institute. A seminar and a panel discussion on 'Emerging Issues to Empower Women' was organized on 5th and 6th October 2007 and a seminar on 'Environmental Issues: Achieving a Sustainable Future' on 15th March 2008.

Talks are on with 'Kripa Foundation', an NGO dealing with rehabilitation of drug addicts and alcoholics to organize a workshop on 'Substance Abuse'.

Staff Development

- 1. A lecture on loans and investment for Class IV staff will be held in the future

 Owing to constraints of time, this programme could not be undertaken.
- A tie-up with medical centres for regular and routine medical check-up at discounted rates for teaching and non-teaching staff is being considered.

This could not be accomplished. However, efforts are on to contact medical centers for this purpose.

 The Alumni association of the Institute would hold its annual reunion, organize fund raising activities and try to maintain database of ex students even in the forthcoming session.

The Alumni Association of J D Birla Institute organized an evening 'Entourage' filled with excitement for the students of the institute on 23rd February 2008.

The Annual Reunion and Batch'07 meet was held on 26th April 2008. The 1st Newsletter was also published in the month of April 2008. Efforts to increase the number of membership are in progress.

 Research: Two faculty members of the Department of Commerce are planning to enroll themselves for their respective doctoral degrees. Faculty members are also preparing proposals for new research projects.

One faculty with the Department of Commerce has started the preliminary work for her doctoral degree, three teachers are pursuing M.Phil programmes and two teachers have completed their M.Phil in their respective areas of study.

 Department of Management is making efforts to develop linkages with international universities. Further, all the three departments will continue to develop linkages with the various industry houses for the industrial training and also for the placement of students. The Articulation Agreement for Advanced Entry to MBA of New Castle Business School, UK has been signed and finalized between Northumbria University and Department of Management, JDBI.

The three Departments have taken initiatives to widen their relationship with the industry particularly with those where students were sent for their internship training. Efforts are also on to facilitate an organized placement cell.

 Efforts will be made to maintain records of the progression of students to higher studies or to their places of employment. Students will also be directed in getting placement.

All the three departments are making efforts to keep a record regarding the progression of their respective students. Though some of the students take up jobs soon after their graduation either at the place of internship or at other organizations, others prepare for various competitive exams or have enrolled themselves for higher education (post graduation courses, professional courses or post graduate diplomas).

More than 60% of students who have completed their post graduation from this Institute (in Resource Management, Human Development and Composite Home Science) have got placement in various organizations and are satisfied with their new jobs.

 Health Services: Panel discussions/workshops on health related issues are intended to be undertaken.

The various health-related activities that were undertaken during session 2007-08 are listed below:

- A workshop on 'Pranic Healing was organized on 26th February 2008 by Mrs.
 Durga Banka, a member of the Yog Vidya Pranic Healing Foundation of West
 Bengal and having 10-years experience in this art.
- 2. A workshop on Cancer Awareness was held on the 7th of March 2008. Prof. A.P. Majumdar, Dean Department of Oncology, AMRI, Kolkata and Dr. Arundhati Chakraborty, Consultant Oncologist, Apollo Gleneagles, Kolkata deliberated on 'Breast Cancer Awareness and Precaution'. This was followed by a short workshop conducted by a cancer support group, Hitaishini,
- 3. The Food and Nutrition Section of the Department of Home Science celebrated the Nutrition Week with a theme 'Nutrition Promotion for Stronger Nation' at the Institute on 6th and 7th of September 2007. Various activities like

- determination of Body Mass Index, free diet counseling and free distribution of pamphlets were undertaken.
- 4. A workshop on First Aid and various lectures on health & diseases were conducted by eminent doctors and professionals for both undergraduate and postgraduate diploma students of the Department of Home Science.
- The Extra Curricular Activities such as independence day celebrations, Saraswati puja, quiz, debate, annual show and annual sports, fresher's party, farewell party, inter college fests etc. will be continued.

The various social and cultural activities that were organized by the college during session 2007-08 to foster team spirit are listed below:

- 1. On 15th August, the 60th Independence Day was celebrated at the college premises
- 2. The 7th Annual Inter-department Debate competition was held on 19th September 2007. The topic of the debate was 'There was a lot in a name, Calcutta and Kolkata are not the same'. Students from all the three departments participated in the event.
- 3. A Book Baazar where book distributors had put up shop in the college premises was organized at the main campus on 18th and 21st January 2008. Students and faculty members could purchase books directly from the distributors at discounted prices.
- 4. The Annual Show of the college was held at the college auditorium on 25th January (Saturday) 2008. Prof. (Dr.) Subrata Pal, ex-Dean, Faculty of Science, Jadavpur University graced the occasion as the chief guest. All meritorious students for session 2006-07 were awarded at this ceremony that was followed by cultural programme put up by the students.
- 5. The Annual Sports Day was celebrated on 10th February (Sunday) 2008 at the Rabindra Sarobar Stadium. Major General TM Mhaisale, Eastern Command graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. A number of track events were organized for students and staff.
- 6. The Basant Panchami Festival (Sarswati Puja) was celebrated on 11th February (Monday) 2008 at the main campus where students, teachers and all staff members prayed to goddess Saraswati to seek her blessings. The event saw positive response from the students belonging to all communities.

- 7. The Fresher's Party was held on 26th of July 2007 and the Farewell Party was held on 3rd May 2008 at the college premises. The event was held with a view to foster team building among students.
- To bring in awareness about the changes made /to be made in the Home Science syllabus an orientation lecture /workshop would be conducted for the teachers of various schools teaching Home Science.

Although orientation lectures/workshop to orient teachers of various schools on prospects of Home Science education could not be conducted, the Institute has initiated a programme on Career Counseling through which the students of different schools are oriented towards Home Science Education.

PART B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

Efforts were made to help the students develop themselves in a holistic manner, through academic excellence, team building excursion and concern for the nation.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)

In order to keep with the changing times, the Department of Home Science has planned to introduce specialized and professional undergraduate courses in its different areas of specializations such as Food Science & Nutrition Management, Textiles Science, Clothing Science & Fashion Studies, Interior Designing and Human Development Curriculum and the syllabus for these specializations in Home Science has been developed and two review committee meetings for each specialization have been held. The proposal for the above specialization along with the curriculum and syllabus has been submitted to the Faculty Council of Science of the affiliating Jadavpur University.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction

- Staff meetings were regularly held in all the three departments during this period regarding rules, pedagogy to be used for classroom teaching and co-curricular & extra-curricular activities.
- Faculty members in the Department of Management have been advised to use the PCs provided to them for LCD presentation in class.
- To ensure that quality education as well as dynamic employment skills is available to its students, the Institute had initiated a 10-week training programme on Soft Skills and Personality Development in association with Super Soft, an NGO dedicated for imparting employability skills and personality development. After the end of 10 weeks, students have undergone a transformation and have benefited from the course. There has been an overwhelming response and students have expressed their desire to enroll with an Advanced Course on the same.


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
