### ANNUAL QUALITY ASSURANCE REPORT July 2014 – June 2015

J.D. Birla Institute is a *Private, Unaided* and Autonomous College located in Kolkata, West Bengal, India. The college was established in 1962 as Smt. Jawahari Devi Birla Institute of Home Science. Over four decades, the Institute has grown with the needs and demands of the changing times. A Department of Commerce was added in 1997 in tune with the shifting zeitgeist; a satellite campus was started in 2002 to house the co-educational Department of Management. In the year 2009, four new professionally oriented under-graduate courses were introduced apart from two new post-graduate courses. Today, the Institute provides both graduate degrees in six disciplines and has about 1800 students. It also offers some and post-graduate courses.

The Institute operates from two campuses; while the all-girls courses are run from the main campus, the satellite campus located just a couple of kilometers away houses the co-education Management department.

The Institute and all its departments are affiliated to Jadavpur University, a world-renowned Centre of Excellence. The courses offered by the Institute are exclusive and no other Jadavpur University affiliate can offer the B.Sc (Honours), B.Com (Honours) and BBA (Honours) courses that are conducted at the Institute's two premises. The college has bee granted the Autonomous Status by UGC from July, 2013.

The Institute was first time accredited with B+ (78.5%) by NAAC in March, 2004. It applied for reassessment and re-accreditation in 2009 and in 2010, the NAAC peer team awarded the Institute with 'A' grade (CGPA of 3.11) highlighting the Institute's constant quest for self improvement and excellence.

It has also been awarded the 'College to look out for' and the 'Best Maintained College' by the Lions Club of Calcutta.

#### **BEST PRACTICE-I**

Title of the Practice:

Revision and up gradation of courses based on feedback from various stakeholders

Objective of the Practice:

The college offers several professional degree courses that require constant revision to keep abreast with the changing global needs and scenario. Hence, there is a requirement to revise and upgrade the syllabus and modify it to suit the challenging needs of a contemporary society and be in line with the dynamic global trends.

Context of the Practice:

Any good college strives to make the syllabus of its academic programs relevant and contemporary. This is particularly true of a professional degree course. The new B.Sc. programs and the B.Com course with specializations were conceived in the academic year 2009-10. The latest revision was effected in July 2015 and is currently being offered to the first year students admitted in July 2015.

Each time the syllabus were revised, opinion and suggestions of all the stakeholders were incorporated - the students who are the beneficiary, the teachers who will facilitate the transfer of knowledge, experts who were well versed with the future requirements of the subject area and related research, associated industry who will finally induct and hire the educated students and ofcourse the former students or alumni whose feedback is of utmost importance. This approach has definitely contributed to the elevation of the curriculum to standards comparable to that of reputed universities across the world.

The Practice:

The college formulated a separate syllabus review committee which comprised of member representatives from various sections of the stakeholders like students, alumni, teachers, subject experts and industry representative. Formal feedback from the students was collected and considered during the revision process. Formal meeting of the review committees were held and the suggestions from various stakeholders are taken into account before finalizing the curriculum and syllabus.

Evidence of Success:

It is observed that revision and upgradation of the syllabus has drastically increased the enrolment of academically good students in each department and they have brought laurels to the college. The feedback from the industry has improved during internship and placements.

#### BEST PRACTICE-II

Title of the Practice:

Special induction programme for students, and parents and guardians of newly admitted students

Objective of the Practice:

The Induction Programme was introduced with the objective of bringing newly admitted students, their parents and guardians to the college, introducing them to the environment, infrastructure and the set-up of the Institute and familiarising them to the rules and regulations of the college thereby fostering a sense of trust.

Context of the Practice:

Introduction of a new entrant into any existing group of people has been a common feature that we come across in our everyday life. An induction programme is part of an organization's knowledge management process and is intended to enable the new starter to become a useful, integrated member of the team, rather than being "thrown in at the

deep end". It is basically done to familiarize the new entrants (parents and the students) with the course, people, college environment and the college.

#### The Practice:

A formal induction programme was planned well in advance. Departmental timetable was prepared, detailing the induction activities for a set period of time for the new students, including a named member of staff who will be responsible for each activity. This plan was circulated to everyone involved in the induction process, including the new starter. The first phase of induction was conducted for the parents and guardians with a focus of the induction were to expose them to the institute by explaining the vision, mission and history of the institute. They are told about the Institute's rules and regulations, the procedure for academic activities such as sessional tests, assignments, seminar presentations, summer training, semester examination, departmental heads and teachers, etc. The parents are also given a form where personal information and contact details have to be filled up by them, which helps in creating authentic database. The parents are also handed their wards' library card, ID card and rule book. The second phase was conducted for the freshly admitted students and they are acquainted with the department and its various activities.

#### Evidence of Success:

The induction programme was a great success that is clearly perceptible from the approving and enthusiastic responses of the parents and guardians of the newly inducted students.






### Academic Calendar, 2014-15 (SEMETER-II / IV / VI)
