

Title of the Event: Celebration on All India Handicrafts Week

About the Event (in 150 words): An exhibition on Indian handicrafts, screening of a film and hosting a special lecture on 'Mapping Ajrakh Textile Traditions through Contemporary Art and Craft' was organized to commemorate the All India Handicrafts Week (8th to 14th November). With an objective to raise awareness and understanding of Indian traditions, students collected a variety of Indian handicrafts and handlooms from all parts of the country and displayed (exhibited) them in the form of an exhibition after categorizing them into four sections, east, west, north and south. Ms. Shelly Jyoti, a known visual & textile artist, fashion designer, poet and curator deliberated on Ajrakh textiles and linked it with contemporary art styles. She showed some of her works that have been influenced by India's material and socio-political history. Her work focuses on iconographic aspects within the cultural setting of modern Indian history and contemporary times, with a particular emphasis on Gandhi's theories for creating moral and peaceful societies. She further illustrates the complex process of Ajrakh making through her film.

Objective/s (intended outcomes in 100 words): All India Handicrafts week is celebrated with great enthusiasm in every state of the country. The entire week of celebration is a special time all the artisans across the country as they get a chance to get focused and exposed for their great work. The week is celebrated in the country with an objective to provide support to the craftsmen of different indigenously handicrafts by increasing popularity and create awareness through talks and exhibitions. The primary objective of this event was to keep alive the rich tradition and culture of India and to

make students aware of the rich cultural tradition and arts and craft of India besides making them conscious of their roots.

Content (Contextual features and challenging issues in 150 words): Handicrafts have a great potential to provide employment opportunities to millions of artisans spread over length and breadth of the country, as most of the artisans have inherent art to be converted in to occupation. The Handicrafts Sector plays a significant role in the economy of India. It provides employment to a vast segment of artisans and generates substantial foreign exchange for the country, while preserving its cultural heritage. Further, most commercialized craft aims for quick, standardized and low cost replication. The strength of hand craft, artistic vision involved and handmade quality are forgotten. The net result is that even when artisans can earn a living by producing contemporary versions, most do not wish their children to be artisans. Surely, some approach must be altered to enable the artisan to be economically and socially powerful so that they can sustain and propagate the Indian cultural heritage from generation to generations till the centuries.
